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Selectmen's Meeting Minutes 9:00 am – Tuftonboro Town Offices

Monday, September 13, 2021

Present: Chairman Bill Marcussen, Selectman Chip Albee, and Administrative Secretary Cathy Pounder.

### **CALL TO ORDER**

Chairman Marcussen called the Public Hearing per RSA 674:40-a to order at approximately 9:00 am and lead the Pledge of Allegiance. The public hearing was to accept title to the private roads known as "Deer Path Lane" and "Farm Pond Road" as "Class V highways" per Article 25 of the March 11, 2020, Warrant. Mr. Greymont mentioned the road was finished and had passed all inspections. The Greymont's mentioned how nice all the members of the community were. Chairman Marcussen stated it was a beautiful subdivision and the development is an example of how subdivisions should be done. Selectman Albee made a motion to accept title to Deer Path Lane and Farm Pond Road as a Class V Highway per RSA 674:40-a. Chairman Marcussen seconded the motion. Motion Carried 2-0. The Public hearing closed at approximately 9:05 am.

#### **MINUTES**

Selectman Albee made a motion to approve the 9.3.2021 BOS meeting minutes as presented. Chairman Marcussen seconded. Motion carried 2-0.

Selectman Albee made a motion to approve the 9.9.2021 BOS Work Session minutes as presented. Chairman Marcussen seconded. Motion carried 2-0.

#### **APPOINTMENTS**

Chris Ruel, Transfer Station Supervisor, updated the Selectmen with the attached figures and information. The group discussed cost vs revenue for C&D. The Selectmen requested a spreadsheet that isolated the MSW and C&D expenses and revenues. The Transfer Station is still looking for per diem employees and have hired one to date. The Selectmen and Mr. Ruel spoke of CIP submittals and budget requests.

Dennis Zilembo, Parks and Rec Director, updated the Selectmen with the activities being done in Parks and Rec. The Old Homes Day had 6 events. The Boat race only had 4 boats but went well. The scavenger hunt had 6 restaurant prizes donated by the Pinecone Restaurant. Mr. Zilembo thanked Jennifer Coulter and Priscilla Keaton for all their help. Mr. Zilembo asked if there was a limit on the members that can join the Commission. The Selectmen stated there was not but suggested to make sure the amount does not hinder productivity of the Commission. The Selectmen also suggested that a treasurer be chosen to help with cash control and to organize events with fees. The volleyball and funnel ball area have been completed and there will be a PUNT, PASS & KICK at Davis field on October 16<sup>th</sup>, CPR on October 26<sup>th</sup> at the Central Fire Station and Cornhole has started on Tuesday nights with 24 players. They have met with the school and the Rec department will have activities for kids on Thursday nights from 6-8 in the gym. Mr. Zilembo thanked Lloyd Wood for all his help the past few weeks.

The Selectmen met with Diane Falcey to discuss bids submitted for heating oil prices. CN Brown came in at \$2.389 per gallon for heating oil and \$2.449 for diesel. Irving was \$2.449 for oil and 2.499 for diesel and Carroll County was \$2.46 for oil and \$2.59 for diesel. Eastern was invited to participate but all their fuel was already allocated for the

year. Selectman Albee made a motion to award the contract to CB Brown. Chairman Marcussen seconded. Motion carried 2-0.

### SIGNATURE FILE

The Selectmen reviewed the Town of Tuftonboro Joint Lost Annual Safety Inspection of May 4, 2021. Transfer Station updates completed, the library has completed their updates, but no response was received from the Highway, the Town Beach, the Police or Melvin Wharf. Selectman Albee made a motion to sign the report. Chairman Marcussen seconded. Motion carried 2-0.

Selectman Albee made a motion to sign the Supplemental Warrant – Willand Rd. Chairman Marcussen seconded the motion. Motion carried 2-0.

Selectman Albee made a motion to sign the Agreement to Disband the Intermunicipal Agreement for the Provision of Aquatic Nuisance Plant Control between the Towns of Tuftonboro and Wolfeboro. Chairman Marcussen seconded. Motion carried 2-0.

Selectman Albee made a motion to sign a Right to Burial, Barker CR2-3. Chairman Marcussen seconded. Motion carried 2-0.

The Selectmen met with Seth Kassels from Camp Belknap to discuss the traffic controls during change over days on Chase Point Road. The Police Chief, Camp Belknap and the Selectmen discussed the current situations and ways to improve it. There is an entrance on Rt. 109 that has proven to work recently. The Camp is going to use the 109 entrance to help with the congestion on Chase Point Road and flaggers with walkie talkies will keep cars moving smoothly. Randy Owen asked if the quality of the flaggers could be improved, he felt they needed more training. The Selectmen and Chief Shagoury are comfortable with the proposal the Camp presented.

A group of Shirley Way and Chandler Road residents met with the Selectmen to discuss repairs to their road. On October 19, 2020, they presented the Selectmen with a petition to have repairs to their roads added to the budget. The Selectmen have many neighborhood roads that need repairs. The current road budget has been concentrating on the cross streets. The Selectmen are creating a warrant article to address the neighborhood streets. The Shirley Way residents were informed that the Selectmen have received pricing to complete their road to the tune of \$218,617.50 for Shirley Way and \$50,147.50 for Chandler Road. Blue Heron is not a Town road and will not be considered for repair. The group was also informed that there are 3 other neighborhood roads in need of repairs. They are Pine Mill Road, \$186,582.50, Tupeck Road \$135,465, and Canaan Rd is \$48,651.00. The Selectmen will have to decide what road will be first, but they are looking to Canaan in 2022. The group discussed completing Canaan, Chandler and half of Shirley way. The issue is Pine Mill is worst than Shirley Way. The Selectmen will have Jim look at the driveway culverts before anything is done. The group thanked the Selectmen for meeting with them.
