Selectmen's Meeting Final Minutes 4:00pm – Town Offices

Monday, February 27, 2023

Present: Chairman Albee, Selectman Pike, Selectman Murray, Adam Thompson, Chris Ruel, Steve Scapicchio, and Administrative Secretary Cami Wakefield.

CALL TO ORDER

Chairman Albee called the BOS meeting to order at approximately 5:14pm and lead the Pledge of Allegiance.

PUBLIC INPUT

None

REVIEW & APPOVAL OF MINUTES

Selectman Murray made a motion to approve the 2.13.2023 BOS meeting draft minutes as written, Selectman Pike seconded, motion carried 3-0.

APPOINTMENTS

Chief Thompson submitted the attached update.

Chief Thompson made mention that the cell towers at behind the Central Fire Station and on Sodom Rd are both up and running. Response around the table was that the cell service was considerably better.

Chief Thompson noted that he has been released for full duty. He received the letter from the doctor today. Chairman Albee asked about car 1 and if it was all in service again and Chief Thompson assured that there were no issues with car 1.

Chris Ruel submitted the attached update. Chairman Albee asked Chris if he had gotten in touch with Blue Ridge yet and Chris said that he had not talked to them yet. Chairman Albee said that his position was to tell them that they just can't come there anymore if they are just going to come in and dump their stuff and drive out. Chairman added that if they are not going to go through the process and play the game right the way everyone else does then it's a thousand bucks and when they start doing it right then we will give them the price that's normally charged. But if they continue to dump and not pay then drive down to Turnkey. Chairman Albee added that Chris has the right to tell people that we have NO obligation to take commercial C&D if they are going to continue to come in there and not pay. Chairman Albee added that they are taking advantage of you Chris and you're 3k behind the eight ball here and that's why.

Steve Scapicchio of Conservation Commission – right now we are in the process of putting a conservation easement on it. Way back when we first started this 20k would come out of the conservation fund, 20k would come out of a partner (Moose Mountain) and then the Town voted to give 60k to round it out to 100K. Moose Mountain applied for an arm grant through the state to get 20k which they received so now we are at the point where we had to get a conservation easement deed to Moose Mountain in order for them to get the easement put on. Steve sent a copy of the deed to our attorney back in January and followed up every couple of weeks and they just got back to him a week ago and sent back a note saying sorry this fell through the cracks, here are the suggestions for changes on the deed, which are ok, but told Steve that it needed to be brought as a warrant article. Steve noted that we have never done that for a conservation easement and Chairman Albee mentioned that we will not be doing it this time either. The vote by the

town had already been done to grant money for this and a description for what is proposed to be done and creating a deed is part of the description. There does need to be a public hearing when we get to the point of creating a conservation easement. At which time we will describe the process that we are going through. Selectmen would vote to sign the deed at that hearing and it is all done at the same time.

Chairman Albee asked Steve how the Mirror Lake river property was going. Steve noted that the original owner Appleton never did anything with that property and when he passed away the family never did anything with that property so technically he still owns it and they never probated it. So, it is in a legal limbo. Chairman Albee mentioned taking it for taxes but Appleton has paid the taxes on it. Steve has also been dealing with the lawyers with this one as well and they just had an inhouse council meeting with the title company who decided that what we need to do is get an affidavit from each of the neighbors saying that they have no interest in this property and then they will do a quit claim deed. The lawyers are in the process of doing this and sending this out to all the abutters.

Nineteen Mile Brook is also going on, which Steve just got the report back from F & B Environmental. He hasn't had a chance to go through it yet as he just received it.

Steve added that conservation is looking at 2 pieces of property one is Williams 83 acres on the corner of Old Woods Rd as Bill Williams is not longer with us but the family really wants that to go into conservation. The real prize that they are going after is right behind that which is a 22-acre lot that is totally land locked where the Melvin River runs through.

The department is currently in the process of an ISO Review. We are in the process of providing the representative from the **insurance service office** all info need to complete our ISO rating for 2023.

The ISO score's fire departments on how they are doing against its organizations standards to determine property insurance costs. This review take place approximately every 5 years our current rating for Tuftonboro is 4/4Y for main land and 10 for islands.

In ISO ratings 1 is the best and 10 is the worst. The islands have no bridges or ways to get land base apparatus to the homes year-round so that's why they are rated a 10.
